- 9. Wear proper exercise clothing and shoes for your workout, no loose clothing.

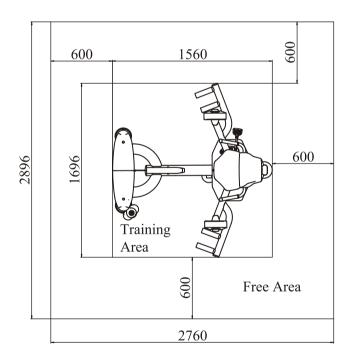

### **Assembly Instructions**

Assembly of the equipment takes professional installers about 2 hours. If this is the first time you have assembled this type of equipment, plan to spend more time. It is strongly recommended to assemble the equipment by professional installers. You may find it quicker, safer, easier to assemble this equipment with the help of a friend, as some of components may be large, heavy or awkward to handle alone. It is important that you assemble your product in a clean, clear, uncluttered area. This will enable you to move around the product while you are fitting components and reduce the possibility of injury during assembly.

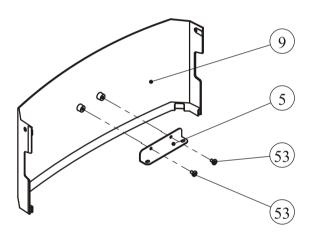

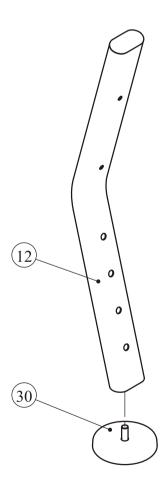
As with any assembled part, proper alignment and adjustment is critical. While tightening the fasteners, be sure to leave room for adjustments. Do not fully tighten the fasteners until instructed to do so. Be careful to assemble the components in the sequence presented in this guide.

### STEP 1

- 1. Attach one Adjustable Foot Plates (#30) to the Back Pad Frame ASSY (#12).
- 2. Attach the Rear Bracket (#5) to the Top Rear Shroud (#9) using: two M6\*10 CRPHS (#53)

**Note: Wrench Tighten Bolts.** 





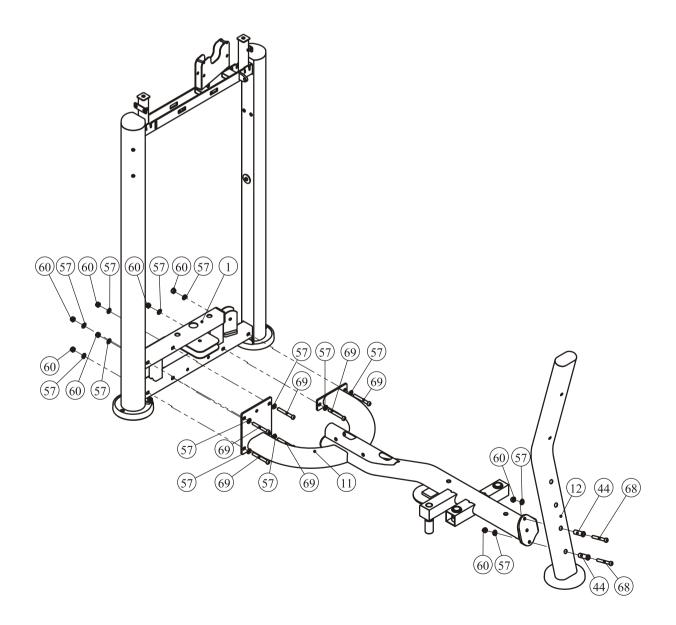
#### STEP 2

Attach the Main Frame ASSY (#11) and the Back Pad Frame ASSY (#12) to the Weight Stack Frame ASSY (#1) using:

two Support Sleeve (#44) two M10\*75 SHCS (#68) fourteen Φ11\*Φ20\*2 Flat Washer (#57) six M10\*80 SHCS (#69) eight M10 Nylon Lock Nut (#60)

Note: 1. Wrench Tighten Bolts and Nylon Lock Nuts.

2. Adjust the Adjustable Foot Plates to make the machines stable.

1. Attach the Shaft1 (#24) and the Shaft2 (#25) to the Main Frame ASSY (#11) using:

two M10\*30 SHCS (#66)

two Φ11\*Φ20\*2 Arc Washer (#59)

2. Attach the Top Bracket ASSY (#2) and two Bottom Bracket ASSY (#3) to the Weight Stack Frame ASSY (#1) using:

two M8\*20 SHCS (#52)

two Φ9\*Φ16\*1.6 Flat Washer (#56)

two M10\*75 SHCS (#68)

four  $\Phi$ 11\* $\Phi$ 20\*2 Flat Washer (#57)

two M10 Nylon Lock Nut (#60)

3. Attach the Wheel Frame ASSY (#17) and the Swing Frame ASSY (#20) to the shaft2 (#25) using:

one Cap Φ55 (#46)

two Bushing Φ32 (#47)

one Φ11\*Φ20\*2 Flat Washer (#57)

one Circlips For Shaft Φ25 (#62)

one M10\*25 SHCS (#65)

4. Put two Tube Plugs □50 (#41) into the Main Frame ASSY (#11).

Note: 1. Wrench Tighten Bolts and Nylon Lock Nuts.

2. Pay attention to the relative location between the Wheel Frame ASSY (#17) and the Swing Frame ASSY (#20).

### Step 4

1. Attach the Cover Plate (#28) to the Main Frame ASSY (#11) using:

two M10\*25 SHCS (#65)

two Φ11\*Φ20\*2 Flat Washer (#57)

2. Put the Left Leg Frame ASSY (#15) and the Right Leg Frame ASSY (#16) to the Shaft1 (#24) and the Shaft2 (#25), then attach the Left Leg Frame ASSY (#15) and the Right Leg Frame ASSY (#16) to the Connecting Frame ASSY (#21) using:

two M12\*105 SHCS (#70)

four Φ13\*Φ24\*2.5Flat Washer (#58)

two M12 Nylon Lock Nut (#61)

3. Attach the Back Pad Frame ASSY (#12) and the Seat Pad Frame (#14) to the Seat Pad Connection Frame (#13) using:

two Support Sleeve (#44)

four M10\*75 SHCS (#68)

 $\sin \Phi 11 * \Phi 20 * 2$  Flat Washer (#57) four M10 Nylon Lock Nut (#60)

4. Attach the Shaft1 (#24) and the Shaft2 to the Main Frame ASSY (#11) using:

two M10\*30 SHCS (#66)

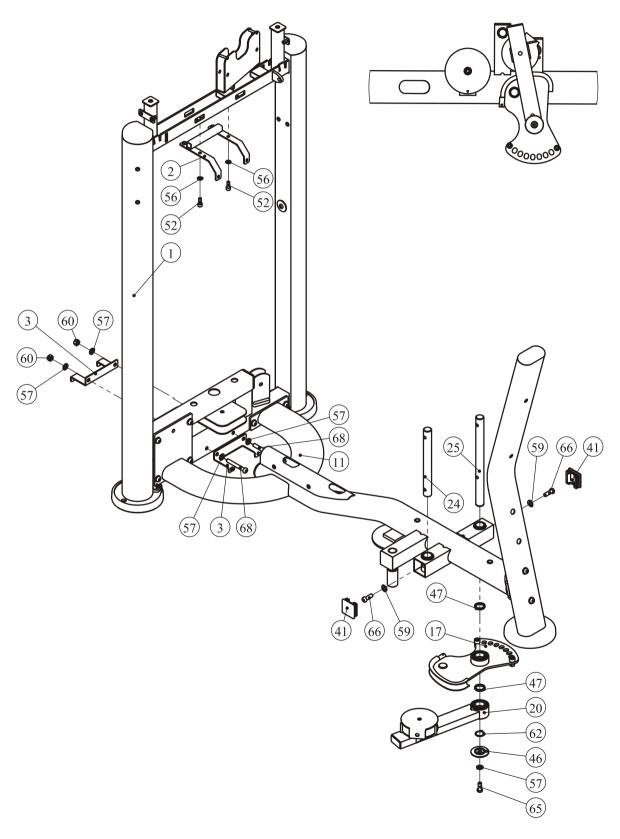

5. Put two Tube Plugs  $\Box$ 50 (#41) into the Seat Pad Frame (#14).

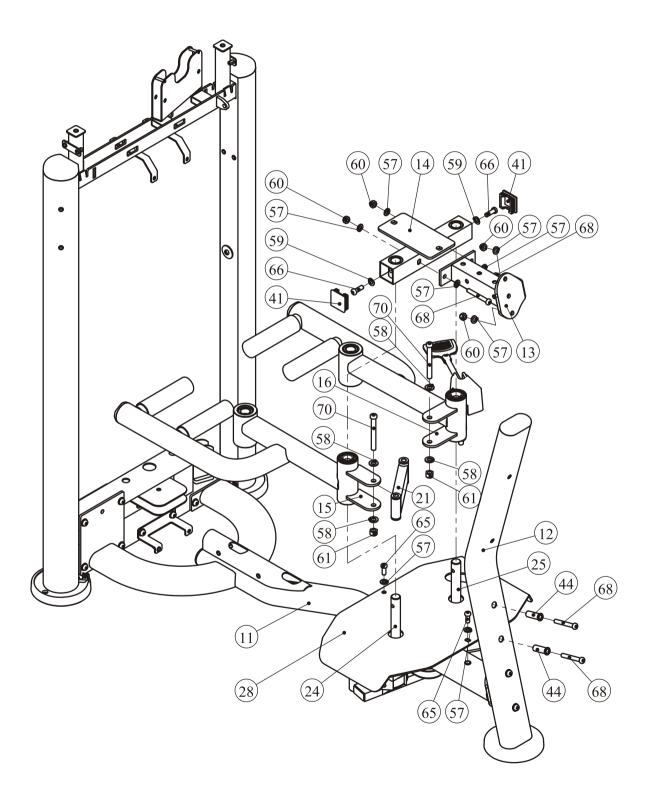

### All weight plate sticker paste schematic diagram

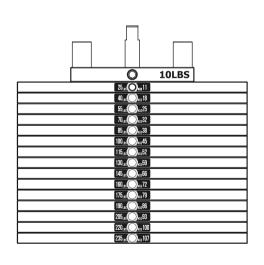


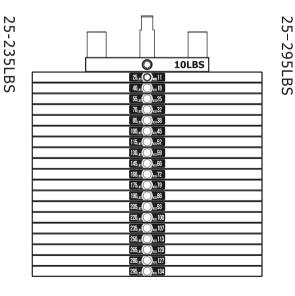

two M6\*20 CRPHS (#55)

two M6\*10 CRPHS (#53)

4. Attach the Top Rear Shroud (#9) to the Weight Stack Frame ASSY (#1) and the Top Bracket ASSY (#2) using:

four M6\*20 CRPHS (#55)

5. Attach the Top Cover (#7) to the Weight Stack Frame ASSY (#1) using:

two M6\*20 CRPHS (#55)

two Spout Plug Φ16.5\*6.88 (#72)

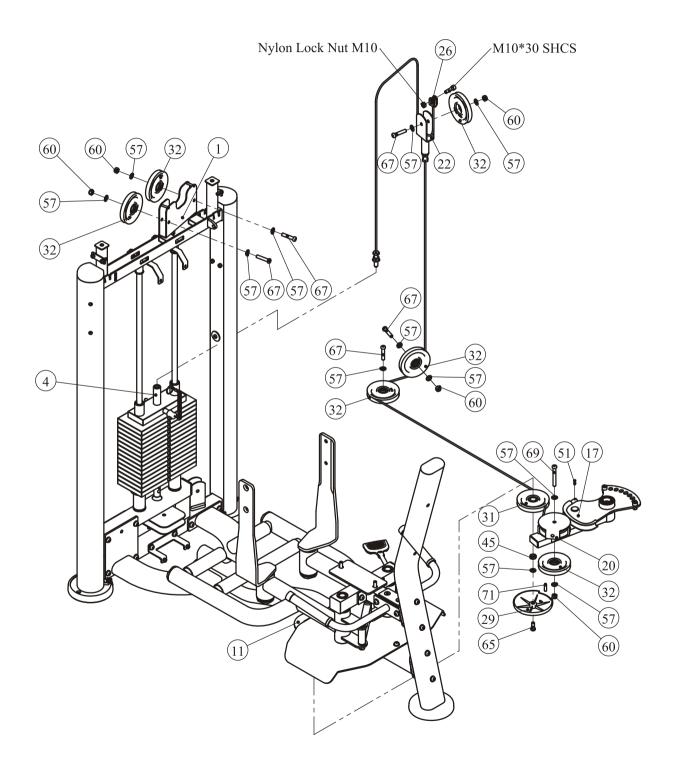

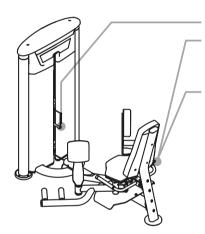
#### The use of Selector Pin W/Coil

- 2. Make sure the Selector Pin W/Coil gets into the hole completely.

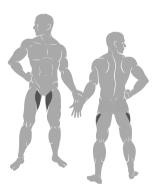

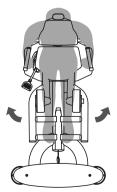




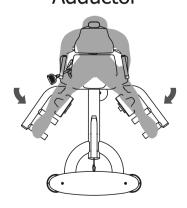
- 1. Select an appropriate weight.

### **General Maintenance Information**

#### Links, Pull-Pins, Snap Hooks, Swivels, Weight Stack Pins:

- \* Check all pieces for signs of visible wear or damage.
- \* Check springs in snap hooks and pull-pins for proper tension and alignment.
- \* If the spring sticks or has lost its rigidity, replace it immediately.

#### **Upholstery:**

- \* To ensure prolonged upholstery life and proper hygiene, all upholstered pads should be wiped down with a damp cloth after every workout.
- \* Periodically take the time to use a mild soap or an approved vinyl upholstery cleaner to deter the onset of cracking or drying. Avoid using any abrasive cleaners or cleaners not intended for use on vinyl.
- \* Replace ripped or warn upholstery immediately.
- \* Keep sharp or pointed objects clear of all upholstery.

#### Decals:

\* Inspect and familiarize yourself with any safety warnings or other user information posted on each decal.

#### **Nuts and Bolts:**

- \* Inspect all nuts and bolts for any loosening and tighten if needed.
- \* Go through a re-tightening sequence periodically to ensure that all hardware is tensioned proper.

#### **Anti-Skid Surfaces:**

\* These surfaces are designed to supply secure footing and need to be replaced if they appear worn or become slippery.

#### **Belts and Cables:**

- \* We uses only high quality belt, and mil-spec cables.
- \* Visually inspect the belts and cables for fraying, cracking, peeling or discoloration.
- \* While the machine is not in use, carefully run your fingers along the belt or cable to feel for thinning or bulging areas.
- \* Replace belts and cables immediately at the first signs of damage or wear. Do not use equipment until belts or cables have been replaced.

#### **Belt and Cable Tension:**

- \* Referring to the Owners Manual, when belts or cables are used check all bolts attachments to be sure they are properly attached.
- \* Check slack in cables and re-adjust cable tension if needed.

#### Seat Sleeves, Guide Rods:

- \* Wipe down adjusting tubes with a dust free rag before applying lubricant.
- \* Lubricate seat sleeves and Guide Rods with a Silicon or Teflon based lubricant spray.

#### **Linear Bearings:**

\* Referring to the Owners Manual carefully disassemble the bearing from its housing and place a finger full of light grease (lithium, super lube, etc.) into the inside of the bearing. Using your finger, press the grease into the ball-bearings and their tracks. repeat until the ball-bearing tracks are full of grease. Insert the shaft back into the bearing and wipe off excess grease.

### **Weight Training Tips**

Use this manual to guide you through the basic exercises you can perform on your equipment. To gain maximum results and avoid possible injury, consult a fitness professional to develop your complete exercise program.

Always consult your physician before starting any exercise program.

To be successful in your exercise program, it is important to develop an understanding of the basic principles of strength training. Now that you have your equipment, it is only natural that you want to get started immediately. First, determine a set of realistic goals and objectives for yourself. By deciding on an exercise plan that is right for you prior to starting, you will contribute significantly to your success.

Warm up properly before engaging in weight resistance training. Stretching, yoga, jogging, calisthenics or other cardiovascular exercise can help prepare your body for the heavier workload of lifting weights.

Learn how to perform the exercise correctly before using heavy weight. Correct form is important to avoid injury and to ensure that you work the proper muscle groups.

Know your limitations. If you are new to weight training or are embarking on an exercise regimen after a long layoff, start slowly and build foundational strength over a longer period of time.

Pay attention to your breathing. Exhale when you exert is a general rule of thumb. Never hold your breath.
